Introduction

This report details and analyzes the responses to the Lagotto Romagnolo Behavior

Questionnaire conducted by the Lagotto Romagnolo Foundation. The questionnaire seeks to
better understand how individual Lagotti react and behave in different environments or
situations.

Research Design

This survey was designed as a quantitative research to gain in-depth information about the breed and collect data to describe, but not predict, the breed.

The study design was inspired by the Canine Behavioral Assessment & Research Questionnaire (C-BARQ) which is a standardized, behavioral evaluation tool for dog owners/guardians, handlers and professionals. According to the University of Pennsylvania who maintains the C-BARQ database, "Behavior problems are widely acknowledged to be the most important cause of premature death (by euthanasia) in companion dogs, as well as being the primary reason why dogs are surrendered to animal shelters and rescue groups. They also contribute to dogs being neglected or abandoned by their owners, and/or subjected to punitive, and generally inhumane, training techniques. Among working dogs, behavioral problems are the single most common reason why dogs are released from training programs."

Our research goal was to develop a deep understanding of the behavior to use as a foundation to come up with a hypothesis for a follow up research.

Therefore, no clear hypothesis was tested for this research as the questionnaire does not seek to explain a certain behavior in Lagotti but merely explore and understand the variety of behaviors exhibited by different Lagotti.


For purposes of this research, a questionnaire with 35 questions, pertaining to the birth, gender, age and behavior of the dog was conducted over the span of two years. However, this report focuses specifically on the behavior related questions of the survey, being Q9, Q10, Q11, Q12, Q16, Q17 and Q18. The questionnaire was first published in August 2017 and closed in August 2019. However, most of the answers were recorded in an 8-week span. The English questionnaire had 926 different responses, each pertaining to a different dog. However, it is important to note that questionnaire takers could click on several options in some of the questions, which is why the percentage often adds up to more than 100%. Out of these 926 responses, on average 72% of the survey was completed. The survey was also conducted in Greek, German and Italian and collectively over 1300 dogs were included in all surveys. While this report briefly mentions the survey conducted in other languages, this report only analyzes the English responses. The questions of the survey were as follows:

- 1. Dogs Date of Birth?
- 2. Gender (with options of spayed, neutered or intact)
- 3. Age at the time of spay or neuter?
- 4. At what age did you get your Lagotto?
- 5. Is this dog deceased?
- 6. Environment this dog is being raised in?
- 7. What type of diet do you feed this dog?
- 8. General daily exercise routine for this dog
- 9. Describe your dog's overall social behavior in the home environment with family
- 10. Describe your dog's overall social behavior in the home environment with visitors
- 11. Describe your dog's overall social behavior outside the home with people
- 12. Describe your dog's overall social behavior with other dogs outside the home
- 13. Alert Barking Select the statement that best fits for this dog
- 14. Digging Select the statement that best fits for this dog

- 15. Chewing Select the statement that best fits for this dog
- 16. Fear and Anxiety: Dogs may show signs of anxiety or fear when exposed to sights, sounds, objects, or situations. Use the following scale to rate your dog's response
- 17. Aggression and Reactivity: Dogs can display aggressive/reactive behavior to a variety of situations. This may include barking, growling, baring teeth, biting etc. Rate with the choice that best describes your dog's behavior.
- 18. Attachment and Attention Seeking: Some dogs prefer to stay close to their people and demand attention and some may show signs of anxiety when left alone, even for short periods. Rathe the following with the choice that best describes your dog.
- 19. Has the dog had any health concerns or health testing that was not in the normal range? Select all that apply.
- 20. If your dog has been clinically diagnosed with allergy issues check all that apply.
- 21. The Sire of this dog had the following health certifications. Select all that apply.
- 22. The Dam of this dog had the following health certifications. Select all that apply.
- 23. Are there any other health related concerns regarding this dog?
- 24. What training has your dog had? Select all that apply.
- 25. What training method(s) have you used in training? Select all that apply.
- 26. What statement best describes your dogs 'trainability 'with basic obedience skills?
- 27. Other activities: Do you participate in any formal activities with this dog? Select all that apply.
- 28. Did you meet the sire and dam of the litter in person?
- 29. Do the sire or dam participate in any sport or working activities? Check all that apply.
- 30. If you purchased a puppy, did the breeder follow any specific program or process when raising the litter?
- 31. If this dog has any behavioral concerns did you contact the Breeder for assistance or support?
- 32. If Breeder was contacted for support what was the outcome?
- 33. If this dog has behavior that is extremely fearful, reactive or aggressive please select any that apply
- 34. Any additional comments regarding this Lagotto temperament, behavior, training or Breeder support?

Analysis - English Responses

Q9 Describe your dog's overall social behavior in the home environment with FAMILY. Choose the best fit.





Question 9 seeks to identify the overall social behavior of the Lagotto in the home environment while spending time with family. 51.69% of the dogs are eager to join in activities and love social interaction with the family, showing that the majority of surveyed Lagotti are gregarious and social. In addition, 33.07% of surveyed Lagotti are companionable, meaning they

are calm, sweet and snuggy with their family. Another 14.33% are more independent with their families, and below 2% are detached or shy and reactive with their families.

Question 10 asks for the dog's overall social behavior at home with visitors. 55.19% of the dogs are eager to join in activities and love social interaction with visitors. Further, 14.22% of surveyed Lagotti are companionable, meaning they are calm, sweet and snuggy with visitors. Another 20.09% are more independent with visitors, while around 11% are detached or shy. It is

interesting to note that, while the amount of gregarious and independent Lagotti remained around the same as with their families, the percentage of companionable Lagotti dropped significantly, while the percentage of detached and shy Lagotti increased.


Question 11 seeks to understand the dog's overall social behavior outside the home with people. 32.96% of the dogs are outgoing, very social and excitable with all environments.

Another 29.35% of surveyed Lagotti are calm and social with people in any environment.

Further, 19.30% are reserved, meaning they are friendly but not quick to seek out social interaction with people. 12.98% are cautious or wary of other people and take time to relax.

Around 5% of Lagotti are fearful or reactive, meaning they either avoid interaction with people or growl, bark or lunge at people. Here it stands out, that overall Lagotti are more reserved when


Q11 Describe your dog's overall social behavior outside the home with people. Choose the best fit.

outside their homes, while still friendly and social. Interestingly enough, more Lagotti are calm and social with people other than their family when outside their homes than inside their homes.


Q12 Describe your dog's overall social behavior with DOGS outside your home. Choose the best fit.

Question 12 seeks to understand the dog's overall social behavior with other dogs outside the home. 27.77% of the dogs are very social, excitable and seek interaction from other dogs. Another 25.96% of surveyed Lagotti are calm and social with other dogs in any environment. Further, 22.35% are reserved, meaning they are friendly but not quick to seek out social interaction with other dogs. 13.54% are cautious or wary of other dogs and take time to relax. Around 11% of Lagotti are fearful or reactive, meaning they either avoid interaction with new dogs or growl, bark or lunge at other dogs. Here it stands out, that overall Lagotti are sociable and relaxed around new people than new dogs. The percentage of outgoing and friendly Lagottiis higher when interacting with people. Meanwhile, the percentage of reserved, wary, fearful and reactive dogs is higher with other new dogs than with people.


Q16 Fear and AnxietyDogs may show signs of anxiety or fear when exposed to sights, sounds, objects or situations. Use the following scale to rate your dog's response. Select the option that best describes the dog's usual response.



Question 16 seeks to identify the behavior Lagotti exhibit when confronted with new or unusual sights, sounds, objects or situations. Here it is important to understand whether or not the Lagotto responds to fear or anxiety and exhibits such and how. Five situations can especially be highlighted. 39.58% of Lagotti show no signs of fear when approached directly by an unfamiliar

person outside the home. 64.73% of Lagotti react to the fear by alerting, braking, lunging or cowering. The majority of Lagotti react by alerting but recover. (Here it is important to note that some dogs have several reactions, hence why the percentage does not add up to 100%). Another interesting situation is when a stranger tries to touch or pet the dog. 57.44% of dogs do not show a sign of fear here, while 46.28% do react. Out of those 46.28%, around 21.71% react but recover quickly. In the third situation, 50.93% of dogs react without fear when exposed to an unfamiliar situation such as car trips, dog shows and vet trips. 52.78% of dogs do show signs, mostly by reacting, maybe barking and then recovering quickly. Further, when a Lagotto is approached by a barking or growling dog, only 13.36% show no signs of fear. While 29.09% alert and recover quickly, another 23.22% will cower and hide. Meanwhile 20.10% will growl or bark back. Lastly, out of all possible situations most Lagotti are the most comfortable in crowds of more than ten people. 65.67% of Lagotti show no signs of fear. This shows that Lagotti are mostly fearless dogs, however especially when confronted with unfamiliar noises or objects most react.

Q17 Aggression and ReactivityDogs can display aggressive/reactive behavior to a variety of situations. This may include barking, growling, baring teeth, biting, etc. Rate with the choice that best describes your dog's behavior.



Question 17 seeks to understand the aggression and reactivity of Lagotti. Here 5 situations can be highlighted. Most Lagotti react when being barked, growled or lunged at by another dog or when a stranger comes into the dog's property. When a Lagotti is barked, growled or lunged at by another dog, only 45.08% show no signs of fear, while 30.26% respond by staring, hackling and a raised tail. Meanwhile, 16.81% respond by barking, lunging or baring teeth. When a stranger comes into the dog's property, 59.65% of Lagotti show no signs of fear. 21.53% respond with a raised tail, hackling and staring, while 14.36% respond by barking, lunging or baring teeth. Lagotti, however react much better to household members. 91.74% of Lagotti show no signs of fear when toys or bones are being taken away by a household member. 95.31% show no signs of fear when their food is taken away by a household member and 97.29% of Lagotti show no signs of fear when a family member approaches them while eating. This shows that Lagotti react better to their owner or family members and most reactive to other dogs.

Question 18 explores the question of attention seeking and attachment in Lagotti. The Lagotto almost never whines, barks or stresses if they cannot see their owner in the home, almost never begin pacing when the owner begins their routine to leave the house, almost never whines, barks or stresses when left home alone or shows severe destructive behavior when left home alone. However, the Lagotto follows their owner around, room to room and sits close to their owner when they are sitting down. Number wise 55.47% never whine, bark or stress if they cannot see the owner, while 23% seldom do. Another 62.85% never begin pacing when their

owner starts their routine to leave the house, while 16.48% seldom do. 66.21% never show signs of barking, whining or stressing when left home alone. Meanwhile, 19.48% seldom do. However, 34.24% usually follow their owner around the home, and 29.43% sometimes follow the owner around the home. 42% of Lagotti usually sit with their owners when they are sitting down, while 36.58% sometimes do. This shows that Lagotto are very social animals and enjoy the company of their owners, however, are still independent and have no problem with being home alone or in another room than their owner.

Conclusion

The intent of this research is to better understand the behavior of Lagotto Romagnolo. For this purpose, a questionnaire with 35 questions, pertaining to the birth, gender, age and behavior of the dog was conducted over the span of two years. Specifically, this report focuses on questions pertaining to the behavior of the Lagotto at home, outside of the home, overall fear and anxiety when confronted with unusual situations, overall regression and reactivity when confronted and overall attachment and attention seeking with family members.

The responses to these questions show that the majority of Lagotti are most comfortable and social with their families in the home and more detached and independent with visitors in the home. Further, outside the home, there is a significant number of those same Lagotti that are socially reserved or cautious with new people. The breed can be outgoing and friendly with dogs outside the home; however, it is almost equal to the number of dogs that are reserved, cautious, or fearful/reactive with other dogs. The Lagotto is a dog that can be quick to alert to unfamiliar noises or objects with barking being a very common reaction. The breed is very social and enjoys the company of their owners in the home. They choose to be in close proximity to the family, whether being engaged with or within view when people are not directly engaged.

Overall, Lagotti react best to their owners, to which they are attentive and enjoy being social and close with. Many are also social with visitors but can be more reserved outside the home and tend to be more independent and reserved with other dogs. They alert and react to various environmental challenges with an overall ability to recover.
